What was going on in South Carolina Central State Government Finance in the early to mid 1980's?

 Idea started with state agency finance officers – looking for help from each other and willing to share ideas with others



- In 1984, held preliminary meetings at the Water Resources
 Commission Offices on Forest Drive
- In early 1985, held an organizational meeting at the SCDHEC Auditorium with Comptroller General Earl Morris,
 State Auditor Ed Vaughn and State Treasurer Grady Patterson present and supportive of creating an association
- In 1985, first official meeting at Wil Lou Gray Opportunity School Auditorium – elected first Board

- Initial actions taken by the Board included:
 - Recognized the contributions and support of Earle Morris, Grady Patterson and Ed Vaughn by making them Honorary Lifetime Members of GFOASC
 - Entered agreement with State Personnel to assist the Association in scheduling and coordinating a fall conference (Bud Thurber, Martha Joye and Jan Latham)
 - Started research to determine best approach for providing a Certification Program for government finance officers in South Carolina






- Hilton River Front on Lockwood Avenue in Charleston
- 106 government finance officers register and attend the conference (our goal was 100 attendees)
- Tropical storm the final day of the conference
- Water in the parking lot over 6" deep
- A guest speaker had to remove his shoes and socks to enter the hotel
- Ceiling tiles fell during one of the session

Years 1 & 2 – 1985-1986 Highlights:

- Chuck Fallaw 1st and 2nd year President
- Charleston and Myrtle Beach Annual Conferences
- Obtained support for GFOASC from Grady Patterson, Ed Vaughn and Earle Morris
- Concentrated on state government membership
- Established and served as Chairman of the Certification Committee
- Negotiated contract with University of South Carolina to oversee Certification Program
- Established partnership with State Personnel to assist with fall and later spring conferences






Year 3 – 1987 Highlights

- Initial work on certification program






Year 4 – 1988 Highlights

- 4th President Jimmy Simpson, B&C Board Administration
- Conference at Myrtle Beach
- Great membership growth
- Improved financial condition of association
- Changed dues structure and registration fees
- Major effort to involve private sector to support association!
 - Deborah Nye's leadership in recruiting sponsors
 - continuing today





Year 5 – 1989 Highlights

- 5th President John Wood, USC Controller first higher ed president
- Myrtle Beach conference
- Strong effort to recruit college & university staff
- Fee structure changed to add agency memberships
- Further improvement of financial condition
- Final work on certification program!
- Scholarship programs planned

- First Certified Government Finance Officer certificates awarded at conference!




Year 7 – 1991 Highlights


- 7th President Paul Jarvis, State Treasurer's Office

- Management under severe state and local government budget cuts
- First Greenville conference
- Continued conference management support by "State Personnel"

- 9th President Deborah Caughman, Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations (ACIR)
- Special interest and focus on Certification program
- Deborah spoke at national GFOA conference

- Negotiated 1st multi-year contract for fall conference







Year 14 – 1998 Highlights


Highlights of the Association
